

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a “disability”?

A disability is a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities.

What is a reasonable accommodation?

A reasonable accommodation is a modification or adjustment to the academic environment that makes it possible for a qualified individual with a disability to enjoy equal education opportunities.

Who is a qualified individual with a disability?

A “qualified” individual with a disability is a person who satisfies the requirements of a course and can perform the essential functions of the course with or without a reasonable accommodation.

Should I indicate my disability on my application?

No, students should not disclose the details of their disability on an admission application. If you have any questions or would like to request accommodations you should contact the APT College ADA Officer via email at adaofficer@aptc.edu.

What accommodations am I eligible to receive?

Accommodations are customized based on the individual needs of a student. Once the student self-discloses to the College and provides appropriate documentation, the ADA Officer will work with the student to identify an appropriate accommodation.

Where can I find the necessary application forms?

The APT College ADA Officer will provide relevant forms to help you document and acquire appropriate accommodations.
